Location: Eben im Pongau, Austria

This prestigious event is open to British School boys & girls, featuring a series of thrilling competitions that will ultimately crown the British Alpine School.

Organised by Precise Racing, a professional ski academy with over 10 years of experience running events and alpine camps throughout the year, the British Alpine Schools Cup promises to be a well-organised competition and a thrilling experience for all participants.

The event will feature slalom, giant slalom, and team parallel events. Both school teams and individual racers are welcome to participate in the competition.

This event is open to all U10 – U18 male & female competitors. BASS registered racers will be required to fill out their registration number upon completing the entry form.

Entry Fee per racer for all 3 race events is £165

Lift Passes

Adults: £47 per day (Born in 2006 or earlier) Youth: £35 per day (Born 2007 to 2009) Kids: £25 per day (Born 2010 to 2019)

You can select your ski passes in advance by choosing them on the entry form.

For spectators who do not wish to ski, you can purchase a ski pass to access the chairlift on foot, then enjoy a short scenic walk to the finish line of the SL and GS races. Alternatively, you may reach the finish area by car. Parking is available at Hauptstraße 386, 5531 Eben im Pongau.

Race Format

- School teams can consist of 3 to 4 skiers, and teams must be single-gender (either all boys or all girls), with no mixed-gender teams allowed.
- Teams race in the age group of the eldest member.
- Individual racers are welcome.
- **U12/U10 competitors** will complete two runs each race day, with their fastest time counting towards the results. The start order for run 1 will be randomly drawn by the computer. For the second run, racers will start in reverse bib order within their age groups, beginning with U10 females, followed by U10 males, then U12 females, and finally U12 males.
- **U14** competitors will complete two runs each race day, with the combined times determining the prize-giving results. Each run will be seeded as a separate single-run race (see BCR I, Article 608.5). The start order for the first run will follow the standard procedure: the top 15 will be drawn first, followed by registered racers in seed point order, then unranked registered racers, and finally, unregistered racers. The start order for the second run will be a complete reversal of the first run's order.
- **U16** and older competitors will complete two runs each race day, with the combined times determining both the prize-giving results and seeding. The start order for the first run follows the standard procedure, as outlined for U14s. The start order for the second run will be based on the results (times) from the first run, with the fastest 30 skiers "flipped" for the second run.
- Racers that are disqualified, or did not complete the first run will be allowed to take part in the second run

Rules and Regulations

The race will be run under FIS rules (ICR) as varied by GB Snowsport (BACR) and Snowsport England (Race Manual). Links to rules and guide books are listed below, all racers and coaches are encouraged to make themselves familiar with these documents:

As outlined in the guides above, helmets must comply with FIS regulations, specifically for Giant Slalom (no soft ear designs allowed). Helmets must display the FIS 'RH 2013' sticker to confirm compliance with these rules.

Racers will **NOT** be able to compete if helmets do not comply with these regulations.

Terms and Conditions

This event will take place in Eben im Pongau and is open to all British schools and clubs. The races will be eligible for BASS seed points for competitors in the U14 category and above. For more information regarding seeding, please visit gbski.com.

All competitors wishing to enter must be in full-time education. Entries for the British Alpine Schools Cup should be submitted by the team manager (either a school teacher or parent/guardian), who will assume responsibility for the competitor. Please note that all competitors must be accompanied by an adult who will take responsibility for them throughout their time at the resort.

Entries will only be accepted upon receipt of full payment. All entries must be submitted through the official entry system by the specified deadline, with each racer named and the form signed by the responsible person who agrees to these terms and conditions.

Insurance Requirements

Each racer or school must ensure they have adequate insurance coverage for ski racing, race withdrawal, and event cancellation.

In the case of withdrawal from any event due to injury (prior to the event) entry refunds will be available on submission of a doctors' note only. Refunds will not be available for any adverse weather / snow conditions that result in the cancellation of races. The organisers will make every effort to adhere to the planned programme. However, should any changes become necessary (e.g., due to weather conditions), we will implement them and strive to provide as much notice as possible.
